Katleen Vinck (°1976 Bornem, lives and works in Antwerp Belgium)

Katleen Vinck is a visual artist who combines characteristics of sculpture, architecture and scenography in her work. Vinck focuses on archetypal structures from nature that can be found as an echo in culture and architecture. It is in the field tension between a scientifically verified past and an imagined future, that Vinck's sculptures are situated.

She studied architecture at the Henry Van de Velde Institute and obtained a postgraduate degree in scenography at Popok.

Katleen Vinck has been associated with the Antwerp gallery Base-Alpha since 2010. She has had exhibitions in the Warande, MuZEE, Extra City, PARK and various galleries and exhibition spaces and participated in projects such as Into Nature, Coup de Ville, Superstudio.... Her work has been shown at fairs such as Art Brussels and Art Rotterdam. Since 2013 she collaborates on a regular basis with choreographer Marc Vanrunxt for whom she creates installations. Since 2020 she teaches sculpture and is head of the sculpture department at KASK Ghent.

Katleen Vinck is a visionary urban planner, a builder of old and new stories, archaeologist of a past future.

With a strong presence her sculptures claim their space in the exhibition room and in our minds. They look like found objects that have undergone a transformation through the ravages of time. Thus, architectural and technoid elements are combined with organic ones, alluding to their origins from natural phenomena like rocks, grotto's, craters or meteorites. The objects are reminiscent of artifacts that seem to have had a distinct function. However, they elude clear categorization. They remain free, open, associative.

In an elaborate, multi-layered process, the works are created with often delicate surfaces made of materials such as ceramics, wood, polyurethane, cement, or epoxy. Architecture and scenography form the sculptor's artistic background. Both manifest themselves in these sophisticatedly modeled objects, which unfold an incredible beauty in all their exceptional, raw appeal. Through their aesthetics, which evoke parts of brutalist buildings, ruinous monuments, or futuristic means of transportation, Vinck addresses, on the one hand, the infrastructure and history of former cities that are reflected in architectures. On the other hand, she refers to fictitious places of the future. Despite their intensity, the sculptures are at the same time characterized by an inherent fragility that confronts us with our own transience. Vinck's works appear like dense models that seem to stand as pars pro toto for the rise and fall of cultures. Ingeniously she connects past and future — in a non-linear way.

Memory and vision distinguish the works of Katleen Vinck. Her cosms are full of history and yet give rise to a possible future.


